


Smile Quilt Bee Day

There are bonus pages of things to search for, and instructions for making sock monkeys, all for a mere \$20.00!


The entire proceeds of the book sales go to the SLF.

"I will still scare the cat, so use it anyway."


"Oh, why not!"

June Executive Meeting Highlights








Stratford Perth Museum
