It may or may not involve calculations of the amount spent before checking out. Although we like to navigate our way to new quilt shops, we can still be geographically challenged with all the detours encountered along the way.

It is in our best interest and, after all, we owe it to ourselves to practice all things quilt related as often as possible in an effort to keep our brains active. 
Using Up Scraps #4 with Vikki MacDonald

Easy Scrap Quilt


Cut Sizes for a 6-inch Finished Block

A = 11/2" x 61/2"

B = 41/2" x 61/2" OR four 21/2" x 31/2"








The blocks alternate horizontally and vertically to create the woven design. The woven illusion is clearer with the careful placement colour and/or value.

















Scrappy Checkerboard

Create a checkerboard by alternating nine-patches.



Flying Geese A Quick & Scrappy Way





There are many websites that explain and illustrate the quick, no waste method of making 4 identical flying geese units. The formula for these flying geese is to have the finished unit's width be twice the unit's height. This remains the same for our scrappy flying geese units. The difference is that each of the smaller squares are of a different fabric (or colour) as illustrated left.

- Cut the larger square the finished width of the unit + 1¼".
- Cut the 4 smaller squares the finished height of the unit + %" and place the smaller squares, right sides together on the large square and draw a diagonal line as shown.
- Sew 1/4 inch on both sides of the drawn line.
- 4) Cut on the drawn line.
- 5) Press the seams toward the smaller triangles.
- Place a smaller square, marked with a diagonal, as illustrated.
- Sew 1/4 inch on both sides of the drawn line and cut on the drawn line.
- 8) Press toward the smaller triangle.

Bring your thimble and join us for a couple of hours, either morning or afternoon, while we encourage others to try hand quilting at the New Hamburg Mennonite Relief Sale booth at the Creativ Festival.

"Contemporary Art Quilts of Waterloo County" - Call for Entry

Joan Hug-Valeriote is planning a sesquicentennial exhibit of art quilts, and a multiscreen, dynamic **video** of **photographs of Art Quilts** created by quilt artists who reside in Waterloo County, to be displayed in the **Berlin Tower ARTSPACE at Kitchener City Hall**, during **April and May 2017**.

It will be presented by The Waterloo County Quilters' Guild, although other quilters from Waterloo County are also invited to submit their work. Ed Video Media Arts Centre, in co-operation with Joan Hug-Valeriote who will co-ordinate the show, will provide the technical equipment (a rental value of some \$16,000 - \$20,000), at only the cost of the actual installation.

The project will include two components: a state of the art **high-tech display** of contemporary art quilt **photographs**, and about a dozen actual **wall-size art quilts**, juxtaposed with the traditional quilts from the preview of the Mennonite Relief Sale which will be hung in the Rotunda at the same time. Quilts should have been created after January 1st, 2000.

Quilters who reside in Waterloo County are invited to submit good quality photographs of original Art Quilts they have created. Photographs must be at least 1920 pixels wide and 150 DPI. This is a minimum. Bigger is better! Group quilts welcome!

These photographs must be submitted to Joan Hug-Valeriote between April 2016 and the end of September 2016, at ihugval@horizonsquilting.ca. (A Drop-box account may be opened to accept and store the photographs for the duration of the project.)

You will be asked to sign a release form allowing the photographs to be used in the video which will be displayed across a bank of 20 Christie Digital MicroTiles, a seamless installation of 4 x 5 LED high-definition screens that will be part of the exhibit.

As you can imagine, there will be costs involved, most of which we hope to cover with grants and/or volunteer work. Most grantors, however, require that there be other sources of revenue as well. Therefore we will be asking that you consider making a donation to show the granting bodies that there is real grass-roots support behind this initiative. Since we will need between 100-200 photos for the video, we think a donation, instead of an entry fee of \$10 per quilt submitted (up to 5 quilts) in trust for the project, would be in order.

This is **not** a requirement for submission and the number of quilts you can submit is **not** limited to five.

Your donation will, however, help the project tremendously by providing seed money and proof of community support. If we manage to get any grant money from the Ontario Arts Council, and/or the Region of Waterloo Art Fund, the artists will be paid a hanging fee, according to CARFAC rates. (approximately \$25 per submission). Otherwise the donated money will be applied directly to the installation costs, which will be approximately \$2000.

You may begin sending photos anytime to Joan at ihugval@horizonsquilting.ca, until we have a Dropbox account set up. If your photograph is of acceptable quality, I will send you a photo release form and an application form.


