Constantly challenging herself with new ideas, Sharon loves to learn new methods for any form of quilting, appliqué and embroidery. Classes have included free-motion quilting, an introduction to "Buggy Barn" quilts, which quickly became a major focus for Sharon, with further inspiration provided through additional classes. Since then, the primitive quilt style has been one of her true passions. Sharon has become a regular instructor herself, with machine piecing, wool appliqué and embellishing stitches. From machine embroidery, Sharon has continued to explore her love of primitive quilts.

Combining her love of texture and colour with traditional, primitive and whimsical themes, Sharon has used embellishments to enrich basic designs, while creating a niche for herself as a teacher in the true traditional style of quilters, sharing skills and passion with other quilters.

From ultra-modern to centuries-old hand methods, Sharon has embraced them all, but her heart and major passion is and always will be with primitive style hand embellishment and the traditional yet modern look this achieves. Join us for the April guild meetings where Sharon's trunk show will feature her wool appliqué pieces and embellish-

ment stitching.






#### Using Up Scraps #11 with Vikki MacDonald Irish Chain Quilts

Irish Chain quilts are constructed using two alternating blocks. The quilts look best with an odd number of blocks for both the width and height. The drafted illustrations primarily in green (*Irish, you know…*) illustrate the block construction and emphasize the chains more clearly than scrappy versions.

Vikki's double, triple and quintuple quilts and the scrappy diagrams of the others highlight the scrappy possibilities for these Irish Chain quilts.





# WCQG QUILT EXHIBIT 2017

We are looking for all kinds of quilts to be shown at our Quilt Exhibit on October 13-14, 2017. Just about any quilt project will fit into one of these categories:

- Small wall quilt maximum perimeter 180 inches (no minimum)
- Large wall quilt—perimeter greater than 180 inches
- Modern quilt
- Bed or lap quilt
- Other items i.e., quilted jacket, quilted carrying bag
- Group quilt
- Small draw quilt these quilts are used as draw prizes and will not be returned to you
- President's Challenge quilt

You may submit a maximum of six entries into the quilt exhibit in addition to the President's Challenge. Please look at the WCQG website under "Quilt Exhibit" to see the revised instructions when making a quilt sleeve.

Entry forms for all quilts need to be completed by the end of June. Quilts will be photographed at The Creative Sisters Quilt Studio in August 2017. Exact photography dates are yet to be determined. If you are planning a holiday in August, please make arrangements with a friend or family member to take your quilt(s) in to be photographed.

#### Workshop: Creating Appliqués Using Inktense Pencils with Kathy Tidswell

Date: Friday, June 9, 2017, 9am - 4pm

Place: Mannheim Community Centre

Participants put their adult colouring skills to work and play with Inktense pencils to create flowers and leaves that will be cut out and used to create appliqués. This is a fun workshop in which participants will learn some of the tricks



for colouring realistic images of their choice and then adding water to turn them into beautifully shaded fabrics. After the appliqués are created, they will be cut out and fused to a background to start a block. Students can use their teacher's pattern for the clematis or bring their own inspiration for flowers or leaves.

CANADA'S BIG QUILT BEE - SLAB DAYS MARCH 24 & 25

Thank you for so generously supporting CQA/ACC and Ronald McDonald House Charities to celebrate Canada's 150th anniversary. Did you know that in 2015, a total of 13,260 families were helped by Ronald McDonald Houses across Canada?

Our "Slab Days" were a great success! With **20** guild members and friends participating, some on both days, we produced **66** (and counting) quilt tops. We were blessed to receive over **250** blocks from the Friends of Schneider Haus, surplus blocks from years of quilt block challenges, many of which we were able to incorporate into 12 and 24 block quilt tops.

# WANTED: LONG ARM AND DOMESTIC MACHINE QUILTERS

Now our task is to get 'em quilted! We have backing, batting and binding all ready to go, we just need quilters who can donate their time, energy, thread and skills to get these items quilted. The quilt tops are mostly 36" x 48" with a few 48" x 72". Our timeline is such that they need to be completed by our **May 15th** guild meetings, so they can be taken to the Mississauga drop off point before the end of May. The quilting doesn't have to be custom or fancy, just enough to hold the layers together.

If you are willing to quilt one, two or more, please let Marg Sandiford know so she can get the "quiltee" and the quilter together. She would be happy to bring them to Mannheim next week, to the guild meetings on April 19th or arrange to drop them off at your convenience.

If you have a top you are piecing, but won't be able to quilt yourself, please bring it to the April meeting as well. Labels are also available from Marg Sandiford.



Any tops and blocks that don't get quilted will be sent to CQA for the Big Quilt Bee at Quilt Canada in

June. There will be a limited number of quilts that can be completed during that time, so the more we can send completed the better.
