#### February meeting: Trash 'n' Treasures Sale and Demos

## **QUILT SHOW 2013**

We trust that your Christmas was a good one. Now that the new year has begun, we hope that you are busy making the quilts, garments and other things that you will be entering into the quilt show. Sleeve instructions for hanging your quilts will follow soon.

Don't forget that the Show will be held on September 27 & 28, 2013 at RIM Park in the Forbes Hall. If you have time and can participate, the setup will be on September 26.

Remember to document the copyright of each entry, that is where you took the pattern from or inspiration for your creation. It is very important. If you have not documented it on your entry we will be calling to ask for it.

Also if you intend to sell anything that is entered, please let the person who will be purchasing your wonderful work know that they may take it AFTER the Show. Since all of the entries are placed according to the entry form, numbered and catalogued in our Program

Book, as well as the CD, it is important that whatever is entered can be found at the Show. Every entry no matter how large or small is important to us and the presentation of the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild exhibition.

We are almost finished preparing the Raffle Tickets for sale, in March. The quilt is finished and almost ready for presentation at our meetings. We want to thank all of the people who worked on this project, especially Marilyn Farquhar, Marsha Clarke, a dedicated group of quilters who appliquéd the leaves, and Trudy Dey who quilted it. 

### **Taking the Mystery Out of the Pinwheel or Propeller Block**

For one block you need the following:

Three 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles of the background colour family. The fabric choices can be scrappy.













For each block you need two segments that will look like this:




To make these segments of the block place a 2 ½" square on a rectangle, right sides together and sew across the diagonal of the square as illustrated right. *Make sure that all segments are sewn in the same direction.* 



Next cut 1/4" away from the seam line, leaving the seam allowance and discard the rest. Press completed segment.







Assemble two completed segments with a centre background rectangle as illustrated left.

The competed block, including seam allowances (raw edges), should measure 6 ½".

Sew four blocks together, rotating to form the completed pinwheel/propeller as shown below. Construct as many as you require for your quilt.

# Get Your Bingo 'Card' ready for some fun at Mannheim

We are going to have some fun quilter's bingo games in May at Mannheim. And yes, there will be awesome prizes as usual.

Here is where the fun begins. You have to make your own 'Bingo Card' or Cards if you want to increase your chances of winning. The 'card' is made of 25 pieces of fabric. Just follow these easy instructions, make your 'card' and bring it to the May Mannheim quilting day.

#### GAME CARD INSTRUCTIONS

Materials for 1 (10½") card (Each fabric must be chosen from one of the following categories: batik, floral, geometric, heart, leaf, metallic,

holiday, novelty, paisley, plaid, solid, star, stripe, or 1930s print. Use a black print for the center square.)

- 5 (2½") squares assorted yellow and orange prints
- 5 (21/2") squares assorted red prints
- 5 (21/2") squares assorted blue prints
- 5 (2½") squares assorted green prints
- 4 (2½") squares assorted pink and purple prints
- 1 (21/2") square black print

#### **Block Assembly**

1. Referring to photos of blocks, join 5 yellow/orange print squares to make 1 row. In the same manner,

make 1 red, 1 blue, and 1 green row.

- 2. Join 2 pink/purple squares. Make
  2 pink/purple pairs. Join one pink/
  purple pair to each side of black
  square to complete pink/purple row.
  3. Join rows, placing pink/purple
- **3.** Join rows, placing pink/purple row in center, to complete 1 Bingo Game Card block.

# Inching Our Way across Canada





If you're looking for a reason to purge your linen closet, I'm looking for vintage "whitework" for use in a quilt project. "Whitework" is typically white embroidery on white fabric. It can be on either linen or cotton fabric from tablecloths, pillow cases or towels etc. in reasonable condition. Stains and holes are fine as they will be trimmed off.

These items can also contain fine drawn threadwork or small cutwork, which is fine, but not necessary, however, lace and Battenburg are not appropriate for this project. If you're looking for a good home, just let me know or bring them to the guild meeting.
