Welcome Spring! We look forward to the next three months of speakers all from Ontario! This month we welcome Joan Hug-Valeriote.



Our featured vendor this month is The Quilt Place from Shakespeare.



The Rag Coat

The Waterloo County Quilters' Guild and the Waterloo Public library have collaborated for a number of years to create delightful book-and-quilt kits for children. Special picture books with a guilt theme are purchased and the guilts in the books are replicated to help make the story more real for children and also to introduce them to a wonderful Waterloo Region tradition – quilting. This collaboration won an Ontario Public Library Service Award: The Ministers Award for Innovation in 2004.

The Rag Coat by Lauren A. Mills was the inspiration for the newest quilt kit. It is a touching story about a young girl, Minna, who wants to go to school but doesn't have a warm coat to wear. Winter is coming, but the family is very poor and can't afford to buy warm clothing. So the neighbourly quilting mothers sew together fabric scraps to make Minna a coat. Every one of those scraps has a story to tell, bringing Minna closer to her schoolmates and friends.

Although the creation of this coat was a group effort by the guild, there is one member in particular who deserves special mention: Marney Heatley. She is the talented quilter who

organized this project and saw it through to the end. All the fabric scraps were donated and Marney said that it's "the stories and fabrics from guilt guild members (that) made the coat possible." Just like Minna's coat in the book, these fabric scraps have a special story to tell, which Marney highlighted by compiling the fabric swatches and stories in a booklet that circulates with the guilt kit. A lot of love, hard work, and dedication went into making this rag coat and the library is delighted to add this beautiful quilt kit to our collection.



Quilt Show Report February 2011



Things are beginning to take shape with all of our preparations for the Quilt Show. The quilt raffle tickets will be available at the March guild meetings. Joan Doke and Joline Freund will be looking after the distribution of the tickets and the receipt of the money. Please STOP BY and collect your envelope of tickets. Included is a photo of both quilts. We again hope that each member will sell at least 2 books of tickets (we currently have about 220 members – \$20 x 220 = \$4,000 – sounds good to me). As you sell your tickets please return the ticket money AND TICKET STUBS in an envelope with your name and dollar amount enclosed. The Raffle Tickets are a MINI FLYER of our Quilt Show so please encourage ticket buyers to mark the date on their calendar and come and visit our Show. **Keeping track of your raffle tickets is important** as at the end of the draw we have to be able to account for all sold stubs and unsold tickets. Please note that the person named on the ticket must be 18 years or older and they must be in Ontario when the ticket was purchased.

Advertising will also be available at the March meetings for you to drop off at other shows, shops, community halls, churches, friends, etc. Jan Hember and Bonnie Murdoch have the materials for you including flyers, posters and the magnets you've so generously made. Let them know where you're intending to go so we can be sure to cover as much of Ontario as possible and we aren't duplicating our favourite spots.

Only 3 more months to consider which quilt projects you would like to enter. Although the show isn't for another 5 months, we need to have a picture of your finished item (digital is preferred and we will have someone available at meetings for this), accompanying story card and entry form for each item to either the website, if completing online or by hand to Kathy Bissett, Marg Cassel or Colleen Robertson by the June AGM (which is June 15, 2011). Entry forms are available at each meeting until the June AGM. For the story card, please remember to include your source for the pattern, who quilted it and personal addition if you wish (ie. inspiration for making the quilt). When considering the sleeve for anything to be hung, see the bottom of this article for the instructions

The Show committee would like to have a CD of the Show entries available for our visitors. We would like our CD to appear as professionally done as possible. We will be setting up appointments at Creative Sisters for digital photos for this purpose during the month of July. The shop will have a setup for the quilts so that they are hung straight, have a specific background and no feet or hands are showing holding up your work of art. We expect to be able to have you in and out quickly with accurate appointment times. Please let us know if you don't want your quilt on the CD, otherwise every entry will need to have a photo taken via the Creative Sisters setup. This process is separate from the photos accompanying your Show entries.

Don't forget to enter any Smile quilts, Memory quilts or Alzheimer projects. We would appreciate those not only to be entered but to showcase our charity outreach projects.

For smaller items we hope to showcase, consider entering things like table centres, runners, placemats, bowls, bags, boxes, pillows, pillowcases and so on. We will have space and would like a variety of the garments we know you enjoy making, such as jackets, vests, skirts etc. Think about the smaller projects you enjoy making for the Boutique, smaller project area and the Small Quilt Draw.

Please consider providing a small item for our Small Quilt Draw. We would love to have enough items for draws on each day. Things such as mini quilts, small wall hangings, landscapes, etc. are what we're looking for. Speak to Bonnie Murdoch for inspiration.

Quilt Show Report February 2011 (con't)

Boutique items continue to amaze me. We have such wonderful talent and generosity in our Guild. Thank you so much for the items that have already begun to fill the storage bins that Doreen Bone and Judy Pierce are using. I can hardly wait to see everything on the tables and watch them disappear into our visitors' bags as the treasures that they are.

Quilt Sleeve Instructions

- Cut width of sleeve fabric 6" or 9" (small hanging / bed quilt size) use fabric that matches or coordinates with the backing fabric
- Cut length the same as the finished width of the quilt
- Do a double turn under on the short ends ¼" turn under will make the sleeve ½" shorter at each end of the finished quilt OR a ½" turn under will make the sleeve 1" shorter on each end this will be your preference and it may depend on how you are attaching the rod to the wall for hanging
- Sew long seam with wrong sides together so the seam ends up on the right side of sleeve tube (1/4 inch seam) press seam open and press tube so seam ends up in middle of tube (the seam will be placed next to the quilt back)
- Hand sew sleeve FLAT to the top of the quilt (NOT Pleated)
 Bev cuts a sleeve for all her bed quilts so it is always ready to be hung up
 I like doing a sleeve with a separation in the middle this allows for small quilts to be hung on a single nail in the wall
