



Arrowhead Block - A Simple Strategy

This block can be done in 2 sizes. The smaller size will be given in brackets. (-)


1) Put 2 10½" blocks together (8½")

2) Sew as in diagram



3) When sewn, cut from closed corner to closed corner.

4) Stack the two triangles.




5) Open all pieces, lay out so unlike colours are touching each other.

6) Sew and square up blocks.

10'z" block size will give 11'z' or 12" blocks (unfinished)

8'z" " " " q" blocks".



hint: when assemblying quilt,

Put white to white on triangles.

It's time for a new block draw. Thanks to everyone who contributed to the February draw. The batik reversing crosses were beautiful.

Once again, we are using Vikki's instructions for the block she took the mystery out of for us at the February meeting, the Arrowhead block. Please follow the instructions in this newsletter for the block size that starts with two 10 inch squares. We would like to have these done with one dark purple square and one light purple square. We will have samples to show at the March meeting and will have our draw for this block at the April meeting.



Machine Quilting Tip

An extra tip when using a stitch in the ditch special foot is to leave the needle down and lift the presser foot, then put it down again before carrying on with the line of quilting when you are crossing a previous line of quilting. You may find that sometimes with this type of foot a slight pucker is forming on the crossings (intersections) and this is the way to help solve this problem.

Sammy's Weighted Quilt

This past summer our nephew called asking if I knew anything about weighted quilts. His daughter Sammy is challenged and a weighted quilt was recommended for them to use when Sammy is having a bad day. The doctors at the CPRI (Children's Phychiatric Research Institute) in London felt that although Sammy is not autistic it could be beneficial for her to use.

At the time I did not know anything about weighted quilts. I went online and found a site about weighted blankets/quilts/vests. This is where I started. Then I started asking questions how to put this type of quilt together from everyone I knew.

Weighted quilts are used to calm autistic children when the child is upset, frustrated or having a bad day. I think that when the weighted quilt is laid onto the child it gives the child the feeling of being in the womb. The weight ratio is for every 10 lbs the child weighs, you create a 1 lb sack of plastic pellets. These sacks can be removed from the quilt to have more pellets when needed.

I had a quilt top that I had made some errors on so I decided to create Sammy's quilt with that. I had Trudy Dey quilt it for me knowing what I was trying to create. I used a good quality muslin to create the sacks since I wanted to have a sturdy cloth to hold the weight of the pellets. I made eight sacks into which I lb of the pellets were put into. When it came to attaching the sacks to the back of the quilt I created pockets for the sacks to slide into. I then attached the pockets to the back of the quilt.



Quilt Show Judging

Instructions were distributed at the February meetings so if you didn't receive them, please contact either Marilyn or Marsha. In March, 2 pieced blocks will be introduced with kits, purchased for a nominal fee. The cost you incur will offset the cost of the quilt(s) so that we can give generously to whatever charity is decided upon. We will also be presenting an opportunity to do some applique if that is more your forte. Start thinking about the charity of your choice as you will be asked for your participation in that decision. Keep working on your 2013 entries for the Show.
