


True North Raffle Quilt

Carol Goddu, a Toronto-based quilt artist, has been a prolific quilt maker since the 1970's. Her appliquéd quilts tell stories, many of which will make you want to burst into song, find a dance floor or laugh with gusto. Carol's quilts have won many awards at Paducah, Michigan and Vermont shows in the USA, and at the annual CNE in Toronto. She often produces a themed series of quilts and has focused, for example, on dancing, the life of Henry VIII and reversible log cabin designs. She indulges in the use of many different fabrics, whichever lend themselves to her type of appliqué.

### Quilt Exhibit 2015:It's here!

Calling all quiltaholics! If you don't know by now, where have you been???

We have all done an amazing job of stepping things up a notch for this year's exhibit, to be held **Friday and Saturday, October 16 and 17 at RIM Park.** Bonnie and I had the honour of sitting in on the photo sessions late in August. Seeing the preview of the quilts we'll have on display was just like going to the movies and seeing all the trailers. And I *love* movie trailers! What an exciting display of our talents!

Here are some fun facts that speak of your efforts:

- Ilene Atkins laid down the challenge several months ago: a guild in Guelph (which shall go unnamed) received about 200 mini quilts for their show. At our last show we had 50 mini quilts donated. The challenge was on! Could we surpass 50? The resounding answer is... YES! At last count the number was close to 70. Way to go!
- Last show we displayed 130 quilts, representing about 25% of our membership—several of the vendors commented on what a beautiful show we had and complimented the attention to detail that went into the placement of the quilts. Kudos to Kathy Bissett for her precision and the incredible thought that goes into curating our exhibit. This year we have close to 200 quilts, representing about 33% of our membership. 200 quilts! Wow! Bravo to all of you! So far Kathy has spent over 50 hours considering where and how to show off everyone's talents (and they will be shown off!)
- Of the 20,000 postcards we had printed to advertise this year's exhibit (yes, you read that correctly: 20,000), almost 19,000 have been distributed. Please continue to drop these off with friends, family, local businesses and any community organizations you frequent. Contact Ilene Atkins if you need more.

### And now for a few reminders:

- Please remember that ALL quilts must have LABELS on them!
- If you are volunteering during the two exhibit days, please **do not bring valuables** into the exhibit. This year our "volunteer respite room" will be located inside the front server in the exhibit hall (where the tea room has previously been located). **This room will not be locked!** We recommend keeping money or other valuables on your person and leaving other items in your vehicle or elsewhere.
- Also, if you are volunteering during the two exhibit days, be aware that we will be taking lunch orders each morning from a menu provided to us by the Timeless Café (located near the corner of Northfield and University: <a href="http://www.timelesscafeandbakery.com/">http://www.timelesscafeandbakery.com/</a>). Lesley, the café owner, has kindly agreed to receive orders in the morning and deliver to us by 1:00pm at the latest. If you'd like to treat yourself to lunch (and not have to make your own!) Lesley's menu will offer a variety of items at a reasonable cost; cash only, however.



• Leave room for tea, squares and cookies from the tea room, located outside the main exhibit room, down the hall in its own quiet room. Serene!

### General information:

- 1. Courses will be held at Mannheim Community Centre, 9:00 A.M. 4:00 P.M.
- 2. Sign-up will begin at the September meetings. There are only 15 spots available in each course so make your way over to the program table as soon as you arrive.
- 3. Each course is \$85. The courses are arranged in order of difficulty, and you may wish to take more than one.
- 4. Each course has a required kit containing items Diane prefers to use. These kits will cost approximately \$35, and payment will be made directly to Diane at the workshops.

### Thursday, November 19: Fabulous Free Motion Fills (for beginners)

Here is your opportunity to try out machine quilting in a stress-free and friendly environment. Whether you are a "newbie", or have some experience but still aren't happy with the results, this class is perfect for you - Diane has all the tips and techniques to give you success. Learn to create free motion background fills that you can sew without pre-marking your quilt. Diane also demonstrates how to mark your quilt and create beautiful (and complex-looking) quilting designs that are easy to quilt.

Yes, you can do this!

**Friday, November 20: Heirloom Machine Quilting** (for confident beginner and intermediate levels)

Take your machine quilting to a higher level using free motion quilting techniques - backgrounds and motifs - to create an heirloom-quality wholecloth wall hanging.

Saturday, November 21: Classic Feather Plume (Intermediate/Advanced levels)

In this class you will embrace the feather motif, using stencils or designs of your own, to add elegance to all of your quilts. Diane will cover various techniques to enhance your feathers, showing them off to their best advantage.

### Our Second "Focus on Quilting"

Yes, hand quilting is alive and well in Waterloo County! Step out of the fast lane and discover for yourself the relaxing and healing properties of this wonderful pastime. Some of the steps leading up to the actual quilting will sound familiar, such as choosing and preparing fabrics for tops and backing, your batting, needles, and thread. And what about basting the three layers? What kind of frame? How do you decide what quilting designs to use?

In the half-day session, participants will hit the highlights and squeeze in as much information as possible, plus have a chance to quilt. In the full day session, I will be able to talk more slowly. There will be time to demonstrate pinning a quilt into a traditional frame and to practise the actual

quilting. There will also be more time for questions. Sitting and working together around a quilt, participants will get a better idea why this is so rewarding.




